

Strong position in the West

PacifiCorp is one of the West's leading utilities, serving approximately 1.7 million customers across 136,000 square miles in six Western states. The company is comprised of three business units working to provide safe, reliable electricity to customers at a reasonable cost. Pacific Power serves customers in Oregon, Washington and California. Rocky Mountain Power serves customers in Utah, Wyoming and Idaho. PacifiCorp Energy operates a broad portfolio of power-generating assets to ensure low-cost energy is available for customers.

Electrical facilities

PacifiCorp's generating plants have a net capacity of 10,483 megawatts. We operate 78 generating plants across the West, including thermal, hydroelectric, wind-powered and geothermal facilities.

PacifiCorp has 62,000 miles of distribution line and approximately 15,900 miles of transmission line – more than any other single entity in the West. The company's Energy Gateway initiative, which was announced in 2007, has been expanded to develop more than 2,000 miles of new high-voltage transmission line at a cost of more than \$6 billion. The plan includes projects that will address customer load growth, improve system reliability and deliver energy from new wind-powered and other generating resources.

Renewable energy

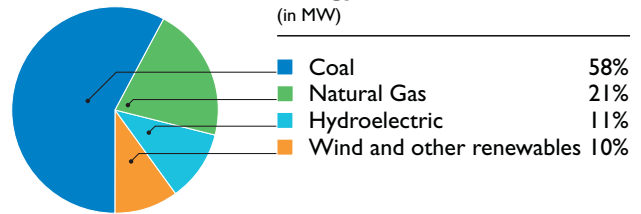
PacifiCorp is committed to using renewable resources as a viable, economical and environmentally prudent means of generating electricity. Approximately 3,100 megawatts – or 22 percent of PacifiCorp Energy's owned and contracted generating capacity – are produced from renewable and noncarbon sources.

Wind

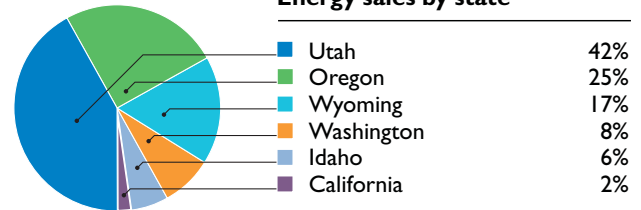
Since MidAmerican Energy Holdings Company acquired PacifiCorp in March 2006, the company has added 888 megawatts of owned wind generation to its initial 33-megawatt portfolio. Another 482 megawatts are contracted through power purchase agreements, bringing PacifiCorp Energy's total wind portfolio to 1,403 megawatts.

In 2009, PacifiCorp placed in service the 99-megawatt Rolling Hills and 39-megawatt Glenrock III wind-powered generating facilities, both in Glenrock, Wyo., and the 99-megawatt High Plains and 28-megawatt McFadden Ridge I project near McFadden, Wyo. PacifiCorp Energy expects to add another 311 megawatts of wind generation this year via a 111-megawatt project currently under construction in southeast Wyoming and a 200-megawatt power purchase agreement.

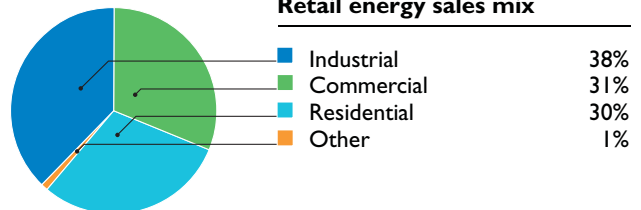
Energy sources owned
