**The Cutler Hydroelectric Project on the Bear River in northern Utah generates 30 megawatts of emission-free energy. We own and operate the two generating units constructed in 1924.**

We are serious about our responsibility as a steward of the extensive holdings of the project, including the recreation opportunities of the natural surroundings, and fish and wildlife habitat. PacifiCorp maintains and enhances what nature offers through significant investments while we retain considerable benefits for our customers in the form of low-cost energy resources.

At 10,000 acres, Cutler Marsh is the largest wetland complex in PacifiCorp's system. We manage the marsh and surrounding lands to protect and enhance flora and fauna and their habitat. The company provides facilities for recreation opportunities – canoeing, hunting, hiking, fishing and bird watching – and research efforts, while maintaining traditional agricultural land uses such as grazing and farming.

While funding and maintenance of Cutler is provided by PacifiCorp, Bridgerland Audubon Society and the Utah Division of Wildlife Resources are also supportive partners. In 2010, the national Audubon recognized our Cutler Marsh – and the

neighboring land we sold to Bridgerland Audubon Society to develop the Amalga Barrens Sanctuary – as an Important Bird Area of Global Significance. It offers extensive habitat for nesting and migrating birds, especially waterfowl and shorebirds. In 2006, Bridgerland Audubon awarded PacifiCorp with its highest conservation honor for our reclamation work at the marsh. We have planted tens of thousands of shrubs, stabilized miles of shoreline and established more than a thousand acres of new shoreline buffer for agricultural operations.

### Recreation at the Cutler Project

Generating recreation opportunities with the same resources we use to generate power is an additional way we provide benefits to the community. A new recreation site, the Logan River Access, was constructed in 2010 to add additional opportunities for canoeing, bird watching, and waterfowl hunting at the Cutler Project.
