Subject – 2008 All Source Request for Proposal - Suspension

Bidders:

PacifiCorp is suspending the 2008 All Source Request for Proposal (RFP) effective immediately. PacifiCorp is taking this action in light of the great uncertainty caused by the ongoing financial crisis. As commodity, construction costs, and market prices generally continue to decline, the Company's position is that bids to the existing RFP do not reflect the current state of the market. As such, PacifiCorp's position is that its customers will be better served by suspending the RFP until a later time. PacifiCorp's position is that once the banking sector has stabilized, suppliers will be much more likely to secure financing. Finally, the Company has chosen to take this action due to the current level of uncertainty in the Company's load forecasts.

Bidders who have submitted proposals have the option to either 1) withdraw their proposals or 2) leave their proposals in the RFP and have the opportunity to refresh them when the RFP resumes. Bidders' bid fees will be returned if they withdraw their proposals at this time. Existing Bidders who remain in the RFP will not be required to pay bid fees upon refreshing their existing proposals. If the RFP is canceled in the future or further suspended prior to the evaluation of the bids, the Company shall refund bids fees to all bidders or to bidders then withdrawing from the All Source RFP respectively.

PacifiCorp will monitor the market over the next six months with the intention to lift the suspension, issue an Amendment to the RFP and request updated proposals from the existing Bidders and/or new proposals. PacifiCorp also intends to refresh its benchmark proposals at that time.
