#### **Recap and Review**

ECC members reviewed the day's agenda. No new items were added. The BCT Broodstock Release Plan was tabled until the next ECC meeting. Notes from the January ECC meeting were approved without edits. Action items from the January meeting were reviewed. Items carried over are noted in the list (above). Stenberg reported that IDFG had completed its Bonneville Cutthroat Trout Broodstock Report. It will be posted to the ECC's website. Van Every asked for a notice of posting when the report is available online.

## **Revised Boater Flow Agreement**

ECC members reviewed edits to the agreement and study plans received since the last ECC meeting. Edits from Greater Yellowstone Coalition were accepted by consensus. IDEQ responded to comments on the water quality study plan from American Whitewater and brought revisions to the meeting for discussion (Van Every will provide by email). Revisions were accepted by consensus. Colburn also provided comments on the fisheries study plan prior to the meeting and comments were addressed by IDFG, but no representative was present for discussion. Colburn said he does not feel that his comments were adequately addressed, especially in regard to spawning and movement. He said he believed the plan should include hypotheses and a definition of significant impacts, tied to exact mechanisms. ECC members decided not to proceed without an IDFG representative. Stenberg suggested scheduling a conference call within the next 2 weeks to discuss revisions. ECC members agreed by consensus to keep working on the fisheries study plan. Two calls will be scheduled: one to discuss what needs to be done, a second to review responses. Voting will take place at the next ECC meeting.

# **Grant Fund Accounting**

ECC members heard an update on Cottonwood Creek diversion screening.

## **Onedia Fish Passage Study**

Stenberg said the Oneida Fish Passage Study was available on the ECC's website. He will be submitting it to FERC with the annual report. Hoyt said he has talked with Fish and Game representatives about this project. He said he thinks we need an update from Teuscher on where his organization is on this. If it looks like there is a reason to proceed, maybe trap and truck should be considered, as it is the most affordable alternative--then watch trends that result and reconsider options. Dahle said he agreed that the ECC should watch fish numbers in the area. Hoyt said the ECC may also consider funding studies to determine fish presence in the area. Stenberg said that IDFG can self-direct and use conservation hatchery funding for studies of that type.

# **Grant Fund Review**

Stenberg provided estimates of balances in the habitat enhancement and land and water acquisition funds.

- Approximately \$286,076 remains in the habitat enhancement fund
- Approximately \$777,968 remains in the land and water acquisition fund

# **Review of Short Forms for 2012 Project Proposals**

ECC members reviewed short forms for 2012 project proposals (See table, Attachment 1). Project sponsors are as listed in Attachment 1. Additional information needs noted during discussion are listed below.

**Stauffer Creek Fencing** – Stenberg asked Myler to let him know when a site visit was planned, as he would like to see the area. He would also like to review the proponent's previous project proposal. Hoyt would like more information on the durability of the fencing. Myler noted that an adjacent landowner may also be interested in a project on his property.

**Harris Spring** – Hoyt would like to know the reason(s) for repeated failures of the alternate water source--and ensure that they are corrected--before approving funding for further work. Davies will work with Ryan Hillyard to address concerns.

**Trout Creek Habitat Enhancement** – Cost for this project was not included on the revised form and needs to be verified with the project proponent.

**Cottonwood Creek Fish Screens** – Lyman said he will be looking at the project area more closely in the next couple of weeks and will have more information at the March meeting.

Additional projects were discussed and may be forthcoming, including fish screens on Cottonwood, Shingle and Station Creek. Myler, Burnett and Lyman will develop proposals for these projects. Stenberg will scope a potential project to purchase a sand wand and train personnel to operate it.

Long forms are due on Thursday, March 1 to Stenberg and Hugentobler. Proposals and applications will be posted to the ECC's website prior to the ranking meeting.

Dahle reported that this will be his final ECC meeting. Paul Burnett will be Trout Unlimited's representative to the ECC for the time being. TU expects to hire a new project coordinator who will take over in June, Dahle said. Stenberg will review the ECC's ground rules to see whether Burnett needs to be confirmed as TU's representative to the Funding Subcommittee prior to the March ranking meeting. An email vote will be called, if needed.
