Updates

Twin Lakes - Stenberg said he received an email update from Shana Murray regarding Twin Lakes' proposed Bear River Narrows project. She said they are working on the Draft EIS but cannot comment on schedule at this time. Van Every noted there was nothing on the FERC website yesterday. Rinaldi said Twin Lakes had filed for an extension for its historic work and got one.

ECC Project Updates

Fox Fish Screens – Myler said this project is not moving forward, as the landowner no longer wants to update his fish screens and would like to proceed with a fencing project instead. Myler said he reviewed the fencing location and the need looks minimal, so there is no need for ECC funding. Partners funding will cover it. Teuscher asked if Fox is still discussing a pond. Myler said he did not mention it to him. DeRito asked why Fox no longer wants to replace the bubblers. Myler said Fox built it himself and has modified it so it actually works, so there is no need to replace it.

Stenberg reviewed projects still open from previous years. **Tingey** is complete, **Stauffer and Spring Creek** are still open, **Dead Horse Springs** is done. **Cove Reconnect** – needs channel lining work. **Hoops Creek** is closed out, **BCT Broodstock Ponds** are on hold, **Cub River Channel** is on hold, DeRito said he will be contacting consultants for quotes and design work. **Sweers** – Stenberg needs to check in. **Bunderson** - new plates have been fabricated; not certain whether they have been installed.

2015 Habitat Enhancement Projects – PacifiCorp Decision

One out-of-action-area project was among the projects approved by the ECC this year and needed the approval of PacifiCorp management—the Cub River Monitoring project. Stenberg reported that the project was not approved. He said the reason was that the project seemed to be the responsibility of others – i.e., the water master is required to collect these data.
