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Study/Work Product Updates

In Lieu Update

Lesko informed the ACC attendees that due to the government shutdown PacifiCorp contacted the Services on January 8, 2018 and proposed an additional extension of time until March 1, 2019. McCune noted that the extension of time letter to the FERC will be filed today.

H&S Subgroup (Aquatic Technical Subgroup)

Lesko provided a Spring Chinook rearing strategies table to ACC for their review and approval (Attachment A). Lesko and the attendees discussed in detail the 5 proposed treatment groups for 2019. Lesko noted that group 1 represented the traditional release group of chinook in February from Lewis River hatchery. In 2019, 4 additional groups will be added: Groups 1 & 4; reared the same but released in February and October. Groups 2 & 3 are both February releases but the feed ration and size at release is different – 8 fpp vs 12 fpp. Also groups 2 and 3 are held at Speelyai longer before transfer to Lewis River hatchery. Group 5 represents a sub yearling June release (which is traditionally the first smolt for spring Chinook). The table as identified in Attachment A is part of the H&S program and represents a much larger release than defined by the Settlement Agreement. Normally, approval of this component of the plan would be provided in the plan and distributed for approval, however, hatchery staff need to know if this is an approved strategy so that tagging and feeding can be scheduled.

Jim Byrne (Trout Unlimited) asked why the proposal didn't add more fish to each treatment group given poor returns recently. Tom Wadsworth (WDFW) expressed that the planting goals in the proposal are limited by space and water supply at the hatcheries.

The ACC agreed to the rearing strategy as outlined in Attachment A. Input from NOAA Fisheries has been requested but due to the government shutdown their input will be delayed.

The Annual Operating Plan is ongoing and the completion goals is now Spring 2019. The H&S plan update is scheduled for completion by December 2019. In December, the H&S subgroup voted to change the group's name to the Aquatic and Technical Subgroup (ATS) to reflect the expanded technical role of the group. The next meeting is January 31, 2019.

Bull Trout Subgroup Update; Tom Wadsworth (WDFW)

Wadsworth informed the ACC attendees that the BT Subgroup activity is postponed due to government shutdown.

Merwin Fish Collection Facility and General Operations (Attachment B)

During the month of December, a total of 800 fish were captured at the Merwin Dam Adult Fish Collection Facility. The majority of these fish were hatchery winter steelhead (404 - 50%), and late run coho (369 - 46%). Blank Wire Tag (BWT) winter steelhead also began arriving in December, with a total of 7 adults collected by the end of the month.


The Merwin Trap was shut down unexpectedly on December 6, 2019 as a result of a damaged cable associated with the lift system. The trap was repaired and put back into fulltime service December 16, 2019.

River flow below Merwin Dam remained near the minimum flow requirements of 4,200 cfs (before Dec. 8) and 2,000 cfs (after Dec. 8) until December 18, 2019 when flows increased to approximately 11,900 cfs. River flow below Merwin Dam remained above 5,500 cfs for the remainder of the month.

The trap is continuing to run and PacifiCorp is gearing up for the ATE study (4th year of behavior study); replicating what we did last year for steelhead. Field work will begin end of June 2019.

Upstream Transport (Attachment B)

Nine Blank Wire Tag (BWT) winter steelhead were transported upstream above Swift Dam in December 2017. Two additional fish were transported earlier in the fall for a total of 11 BWT steelhead collected and transported in fall/winter 2017. An additional 1,216 BWT winter steelhead were transported upstream for a total of 1,227 fish transported as part of the 2018 run year. Seven BWT winter steelhead were captured in December 2018 and were transported upstream as part of the 2019 run year.

A total of 700 adult spring Chinook were transported upstream as part of the 2018 run. Of these fish, 329 were transported from the Merwin Dam Fish Collection Facility with an additional 371 fish being transported from the Lewis River Hatchery. Transported upstream were 177 females, 491 Males, and 32 jacks. By the end of June, all surplus adult spring Chinook previously being held at Lewis River Hatchery had been distributed into the upper basin or used as brood stock.

By the end of December 2018, 2,148 adult early-run coho (1,173 male/662 female) had been transported upstream along with 313 wild jacks. An additional 4,823 adult late-coho along with 89 wild jacks had also been transported upstream.

Swift Floating Surface Collector (Attachment B)

The Swift Reservoir Floating Surface Collector was returned to service on October 15, 2018. For the month of December, only 1,045 fish had been collected. The majority (95%) of these fish were out-migrating juvenile coho (n=992).

Karchesky informed the ACC that divers are in today to begin assembly of the net transition structure (NTS) and they will start in earnest Monday, January 14 2019. The FSC remains off for the month during construction but will be turned back on February 4, 2019.


