#### **Review of Agenda and Finalize Meeting Notes**

Kirk Naylor (PacifiCorp Energy) called the meeting to order at 9:15am. Naylor asked if the TCC attendees had any additions or changes to the agenda. No additions were requested. Naylor informed the TCC that the optional field visit may not take place due to the confidential land update discussions which required critical decisions at today's meeting.

Naylor reviewed the TCC Draft 5/12/10 meeting notes and asked for any comments and/or additional changes. The meeting notes were approved at 9:20am without changes.

#### Merwin Fish sorting Facility Access Road

Naylor informed the TCC attendees that the proposed Merwin Fish Handling Facility located at the base of Merwin Dam may have ten trucks per day or more going in/out. The current access road goes through PacifiCorp's high security, and shop/maintenance area which represents a safety issue and conflict with operations. **Attachment A** illustrates (roughly) the current location of an existing orphaned road that is proposed for re-opening to provide a new single lane road to access the Merwin Fish Handling Facility. The road is located on the photo by the white line. The location follows an existing road bed located partially in the WHMP management area and may require removal of approximately 3 alder trees.

PacifiCorp will go through all appropriate permitting processes. The road is approximately 175' from the river; no stream crossings exist and very low vegetation disturbance. WDFW noted that it may be necessary to provide a turn lane in the existing road that leads to the launch ramp. Naylor communicated that the permitting process will require appropriate public safety and traffic signs.

## The TCC attendees approved PacifiCorp to proceed with the new Merwin Fish Sorting Facility Access road.

McCune will email a copy of the map illustrating the existing Merwin Access Road to Susan Cierebiei at WDFW.

#### **Yale Lands Update**

#### **Columbia Land Trust Update (CONFIDENTIAL)**

Naylor informed the TCC attendees that the Land Acquisition Subgroup and Columbia Land Trust met on June 1, 2010 to discuss and create a straw-man memo to respond to a counter offer. The memo is meant to illustrate the mutual benefits of the PacifiCorp habitat management funding and the need to continue pursuing an agreement that allows habitat enhancements funded as part of the agreement. Discussion included land trade interests and other aspects of conservation easements.

In addition, if critical resource assets are affected in this specific land acquisition the TCC will involve the appropriate committees such as the Aquatic Coordination Committee, Recreation Advisory Committee, and the Shoreline Management Plan.
