SUMMARY OF RESULTS FROM THE PREVIOUS RRMP CALENDAR YEAR ACTION PLAN

Projects Completed Last Year (CY2021) Not Including Annual Routine Actions

Annual recreation facility operation and maintenance was provided by USDA-FS using funds provided by PacifiCorp (Section 3.1).

Project recreation sites continue to be directly managed by USDA-FS with no concessionaire (RRMP Section 3.1).

Recreation capital actions (Deferred Maintenance, Forest Plan Compliance, and Capital Improvements) completed are identified in the current RAP Attachment C (RRMP Sections 3.2, 3.3).

<u>Projects Not Completed and Carried Forward to the Current Year (CY 2022): May Include Annual Routine Actions That Are Not Completed</u>

Recreation Capital actions to be completed in 2022 are identified in the current RAP Attachment C (RRMP Sections 3.2, 3.3). USDAFS will re-evaluate capital improvement needs and develop a plan for redistributing existing funding\accounts. The plan will address tasks in RAP Attachment C that have not been completed.

USDA-FS will continue to work toward development of a Recreation I&E plan and consider retaining a third party (intern or consultant) to complete the I&E Plan (RRMP Section 3.5).

Under RRMP Section 3.4: Recreation Monitoring (SA 17.10), PacifiCorp did not receive the overall use report with statement on capacity thresholds for the 2021 recreation season. This will be incorporated into the report for the 2022 NVUM Survey.

Unanticipated Events in 2021

The COVID – 19 out-break continued into 2021 but did not result in recreation facility closures.

Several large fire complexes (Jack, Rough Patch, Devils Knob) occurred on the Umpqua National Forest during the 2021 recreation season. This resulted in the closure of Project access roads including St. Hwy 138. No Project related recreation facilities were directly affected by the fire. However, the combination of reduced access and periods of heavy smoke adversely affected recreation

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users and use levels. Additionally, Umpqua National Forest Staff were redirected from recreation program tasks to fire-fighting activities.

CHANGES IN RRMP RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES: ASSUMPTIONS, RATIONALE, AND PERCENTAGES

Funding for Douglas County Sheriff Office will now be provided directly to DCSO rather than to the USDA-FS. This is reflected in RRMP Section 3.5 above.

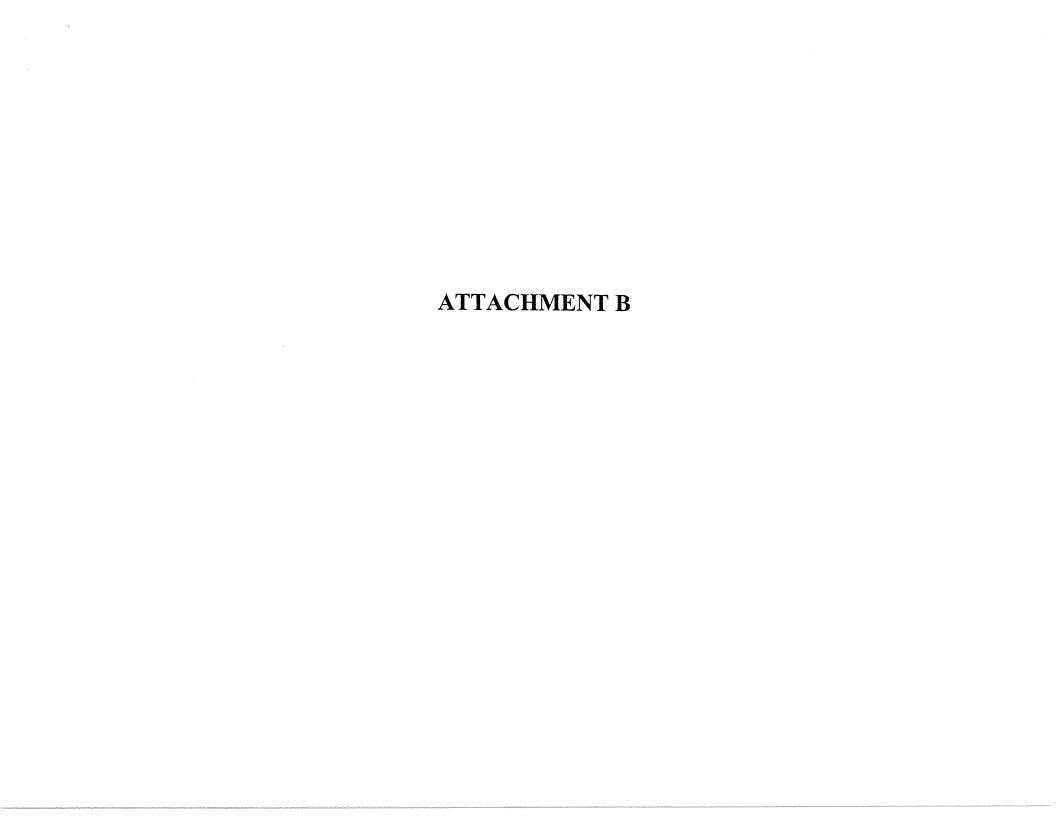

3.2 Recreation Forest Plan Compliance (pages 24-26)	 PacifiCorp will provide funding to the USDA-FS for Forest Plan Compliance actions per Exhibits A, D, and E in two phases: 1) in 2004 (50%) totaling \$150,000 and 2) in 2007 (50%) totaling \$150,000 (costs escalated). USDA-FS will schedule and implement these actions per Exhibit D. USDA-FS to provide PacifiCorp with quarterly reports of completed actions and cost expenditures.

PacifiCorp will develop construction documents and submit them to USDA-FS for review and approval per the process defined in the RCP. Recreation site designs will consider guidance per the USDA-FS Built Environment Image Guide (BEIG) (see AMP Exhibit G), appropriate Recreation Opportunity Spectrum (ROS) area character description, and Scenic Byway design guidelines, as appropriate. Recreation site designs will incorporate the most current ADAAG requirements, as amended, at the time of design. PacifiCorp and USDA-FS will reconfirm, schedule, and track these projects at annual RAP meetings, or as needed. USDA-FS will validate Congressional funding commitments for all joint or shared projects. If funding is delayed, projects may be deferred or roles/phases may be reassessed or shifted, as needed. USDA-FS will provide an estimate of reimbursed user fees that may be used to credit capital and O&M costs at annual RAP meetings (see 3.1 Recreation Annual O&M).

3.4 Recreation Monitoring (pages 28-33)	 PacifiCorp will support ongoing USDA-FS annual monitoring activities by providing additional funding per Exhibits A and D (\$6,000 annually) (escalated). PacifiCorp will support larger periodic monitoring/survey efforts in consultation with USDA-FS by providing additional funding per Exhibits A and D (\$66,000 total cap to be used approximately every 10-12 years) (escalated). These surveys should coincide with FERC Form 80 filings if possible and may possibly dovetail with National Forest Recreation Surveys conducted approximately every 4-5 yrs. USDA-FS and PacifiCorp will agree on need and methods at annual RAP meetings or as needed. For developed day use sites and boat launches, additional data collection techniques and capacity threshold levels will be developed and discussed at annual RAP meetings, or as needed. For developed day use sites and boat launches, PacifiCorp will summarize these data and report them to the RCC when use levels reach 40% average occupancy for 3 out of 5 consecutive years during the peak recreation season (Memorial Day to Labor Day). Decisions on when new developed recreation facilities are needed, or when existing ones should be expanded, will be discussed at annual RAP meetings, or as needed. Refer to RRMP Section 3.4.4 for capacity threshold guidance. PacifiCorp will prepare and file FERC Form 80 with FERC every 6 years. USDA-FS will review this report prior to filing. Periodic larger scale surveys (noted above) should coincide
3.5 Recreation Public Information (pages 33-35)	 USDA-FS and PacifiCorp will coordinate activities related to public information, recreation, and interpretation and education (I&E). Interpretive messages and materials will be mutually agreed upon between the 2 parties. New USDA-FS signs and ongoing I&E O&M will be partially funded by PacifiCorp per Exhibit A at \$6,000 (escalated) annually beginning in 2005 and will be coordinated at annual RAP meetings. New USDA-FS I&E signs at Project-related recreation sites will be funded by PacifiCorp via one payment of \$84,000 (escalated) in 2004 and be coordinated at annual RAP meetings.

USDA-FS and DCSO law enforcement activities will be reviewed annually including summer weekend and holiday coverage and the season as a whole extending from late April through the end of October. Via USDA-FS, DCSO will provide an annual summary of their activities at the Project. PacifiCorp will review annual DCSO reports and may suggest needed changes or emphasis redirection. If services are not being performed as agreed upon, funding may be shifted to another entity.
