Dear Mr. Howison:

Our office recently received a request for concurrence on an addition to the APE and a survey report of that addition. The report has been assigned SHPO Report# 27586 and added to the SHPO Library. Oregon SHPO concurs with the addition to the APE and that the undertaking will likely have no effect on any significant archaeological objects or sites within that addition. Based on the information provided, additional archaeological research is not anticipated for APE addition. In the unlikely event an archaeological object or site (i.e., historic or prehistoric) is encountered during project implementation, all ground disturbance at the location should cease immediately until a professional archaeologist can be contacted to evaluate the discovery. Under state law (ORS 358.905-955 & ORS 97.740) archaeological sites, objects and human remains are protected on both public and private land in Oregon. If you have not already done so, be sure to consult with all appropriate Indian tribes regarding your proposed project. If you have any questions regarding any future discovery or this letter, feel free to contact me at your convenience.

This letter refers to archaeological resources only. Comments pursuant to a review for above-ground historic resources will be sent separately.
