2) On slide 101 of the June 28-29 meeting you indcated that the 10% conservation credit is applied to Oregon and Washington, but not Idaho. The 10% Credit is required per the Northwest Power Act and includes Idaho.

## **PacifiCorp Response:**

While the Northwest Power and Conservation Council's cost-effectiveness analysis is guided by the Northwest Power Act, PacifiCorp's analysis is based on guidance from each of its state commissions. The Oregon and Washington commissions have directed the use of the 10% credit in energy efficiency cost-effectiveness calculations, however, the Idaho commission has not provided that direction. As discussed at the June 29, 2018, public input meeting the Idaho Public Utility Commission found that "the UCT [Utility Cost Test] more accurately assesses the value of energy efficiency as a resource." (Order no. 33766, page 5).
