PacifiCorp Response:

PacifiCorp has initiated this process with the Bureau of Land Management to ensure there was an area available if a new landfill needed to be built. As it is a multi-year process, no final decisions on payment amount or timing have been made.

3. Please explain PacifiCorp's request for proposals for Carbon Capture projects used for Enhanced Oil Recovery, as reported in the Gillette News Record, including how much such proposals would cost and implementation timelines.

PacifiCorp Response:

Late in 2018, PacifiCorp issued a request for "Expression of Interest" for a carbon capture / enhanced oil recovery feasibility study at the Dave Johnston plant. PacifiCorp has received preliminary feasibility studies from three parties that are currently under review under confidentiality agreement terms. Detailed costs and implementation timelines will be developed in future feasibility study phases, if PacifiCorp identifies a viable path to proceed with any or all of the respective respondents.
