

Welcome to PacifiCorp's Dispersed Shoreline Campsite Program

The following rules apply to everyone camping in designated PacifiCorp dispersed shoreline campsites:

- Visitors camping at undesignated sites on PacifiCorp property are subject to removal and prosecution by law enforcement officials. Additionally, dispersed campers are responsible to provide proof of registration upon request for verification by law enforcement.
- All applicable laws regarding public safety, illegal substances, sanitation, boating and fires will be enforced.
- **DISCHARGING FIREARMS IS NOT ALLOWED** on PacifiCorp property unless during a designated hunting season.
- Fireworks and other explosives are not permitted. Disposable grills are not permitted.
- **PACK IT OUT!** Take your garbage and trash, and all of your camping items, with you when you leave. It's up to YOU to maintain this camping opportunity for years to come.
- Damage to trees, vegetation or amenities (i.e.: picnic tables, fire rings) is not permitted. No trees alive or dead shall be cut for firewood or any other purpose. *This includes throwing axes and driving nails/spikes into trees, these actions can kill them!*
- Wildlife is not to be disturbed or harassed for any reason.
- The building of makeshift structures such as docks, tables, benches, outhouses, etc. is not permitted. Please plan ahead in case amenities such as picnic tables are not available.
- Maximum stay is limited to 7 days.
- Site capacity is limited to 12 people.

Sanitation: *to prevent disease and leave a clean camp for others, always:*

- Choose a suitable screened spot at least 100 feet from the reservoir or any stream.
- Dig a hole about 6" deep by 8" in diameter. A hand trowel was provided to you for this purpose.
- After use, put your toilet paper in and fill the hole with soil and replace the duff.

Fire Prevention:

- **All fires shall be confined to existing, provided USFS approved steel fire rings.** Do not build multiple fire rings. Do not use camper-built fire rings if found at your site.
- Clear all vegetation away from fire rings; ensure there are no low hanging branches above.
- Only burn wood that fits inside the fire ring to prevent it from escaping.
- If a WA State Department of Natural Resources campfire ban is in place, no fires are allowed at dispersed shoreline campsites on PacifiCorp property. If a US Forest Service campfire ban is in place, no fires are allowed at dispersed shoreline campsites within the Drift Creek Cove of Swift Reservoir. **Know where you are and follow the fire bans!**
- Have a bucket and shovel available to control or extinguish fire. Be sure your fire is **DEAD OUT** before you leave. Drown it, turn it, and stir until cool to the touch.
