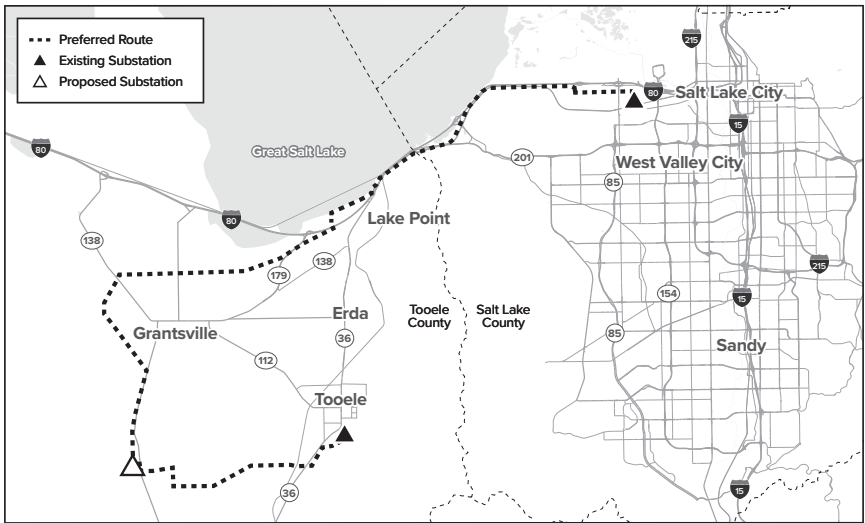


Limber to Terminal Transmission Expansion – Segment C

525/345/138 kV Project

PacifiCorp, which operates as Rocky Mountain Power, is in the process of obtaining permits to build the Limber to Terminal transmission expansion project in Utah. This is part of PacifiCorp's larger Energy Gateway Transmission Expansion program to reliably serve customers' future energy needs by connecting and optimizing diverse, clean energy sources from across the West.

The project involves building a high-voltage transmission line from the proposed Limber substation near Grantsville, Utah, to the Terminal substation in Salt Lake City, Utah, as shown in the map below. The project will feature approximately 56 miles of new transmission lines, a new substation, upgrades to two existing substations and re-routing some existing transmission lines.



The project involves engagement and collaboration with the following local land use authorities: Tooele County, Salt Lake County, Grantsville City, Salt Lake City, Magna, Lake Point, Erda, and Tooele City. A notice of intent has been filed with each of these entities.
